It's a route his ancestors have taken since the goats were introduced by Spanish settlers in the 17th century. But this traditional transhumant system is becoming increasingly difficult to maintain in modern-day Argentina, threatening the survival of the goats and the fami- mers in the highlands, the

Neuquén Criollo goats are not a Patagonia. formally-recognised breed in Argentina, but their owners, the crianceros, know them well: the hardy animals have consistently provided generations of crianceros and their families with high quality meat. 




### Feedipedia: An on-line encyclopedia of animal feeds

Feedipedia is an open access information system on animal feed resources that provides information on nature, occurrence, chemical composition, nutritional value and safe use of nearly 1400 worldwide livestock feeds. It is managed jointly by INRA, CIRAD, AFZ and FAO.

The main objective of Feedipedia is to provide extension and development workers, planners, project formulators, livestock farmers, science managers, policy makers, students and researchers with the latest scientific information to help them identify, characterize and • properly use feed resources to sustainably develop the live-

stock sector.

This is particularly important in emerging and developing countries where feed resources available locally are often under-utilized due to lack of information. Providing global knowledge on feed resources, including unconventional and lesser known ones, contributes to the development and use of innovative and appropriate feeding options and strategies.

Feeds datasheets contain the following information:

- Feed names, including vernacular and scientific names •
- Description of the plants or plant parts/products used as feed

- Feeding recommendations for the main livestock species: cattle, sheep, goats, camels, poultry, pigs, rabbits, horses, fish and crustaceans
- Tables of composition and nutritive value
- Illustrations, including photos and processing charts
- Distribution and basic agronomic information
- Forage management
- Processes for improving nutritional value
- Potential constraints such as presence of anti-nutritional and toxic factors
- Environmental impact of the production and use of feeds

A three-day short course on goat artificial insemination is scheduled for Aug. 11-13 at North Carolina State University in Raleigh, N.C.

The course will feature presentations by faculty members from North Carolina State University and North Carolina A&T State University. It is designed to provide participants with the background and hands-on practice needed to include artificial Continuing Education Credit: insemination in goat breeding programs.

Morning lectures from N.C. State and N.C. A&T State faculty members will be followed by afternoon hands-on practice sessions. Topics to be covered

include anatomy and physiology of the female reproductive tract, estrous synchronization, ovulation synchronization, AI breeding techniques (standard and improved), use of fresh, chilled and frozen semen and management considerations including record keeping systems, facilities requirements and preand post-breeding management.

#### Dairy Goat Conference, China, November 2014

We wanted to give you some early information about the planned Dairy Goat Conference in China's Shaanxi Province, Fuping County.

The conference on Goat Milk Quality in Norway in June 2013 made a deep impression on many of our friends in China. The opportunity to meet ex-

perts from so many other countries has prompted them to plan a conference for November 2014.

Now is a particularly important time in China, as their government is paying close attention to the development of dairy industry and the creation of "cow and dairy goat co-development

strategy" policies. The number of dairy goats in China is about 13 million in 2013, with 2.4 million in Shaanxi alone and 85% of goat milk processing enterprises in China are in the Shaanxi Province. The dairy products by them account for 87% of the goat milk market in China.

## 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual National Goat Expo, September 25-29, 2014

This year will be our 3rd Annual National Goat Expo. This year's NGE will take place September 25-29, 2014 at the McLean County Fairgrounds in Bloomington, Illinois.

The first year was a huge success with 400-450 goats in attendance in 2012 with about 600-800 people in attendance with their goats or for seminars. In 2013, we increased to a total of 825 goats in attendance for show and exhibit, people in numbers for the 5 days increased to 2500+ attending seminars and shows, showing goats or being vendors. We were super excited to have this increase in attendance and the number of goats showing at NGE. Boer goats were the highest in number with 162 goats.

This year we have increased

the number of shows and added 2 new breeds for shows at the NGE. ADGA shows increased from 4 to 6 shows, 2-4 of them being dual sanctioned with AGS. MGR went up to 3 shows, MDGA/TMGR will have 2 ing done by David and Brittany dual sanctioned shows, MSFGA will have 4 shows, ABGA will have 3 shows, we have added the Kinder breed to the NGE and they will be having 3 shows, we have also added the Nigora breed to the NGE and they will be having 1-2 shows this year. The Pygmy shows increased to 3 shows as well for NPGA. These shows will begin on Thursday September 25, 2014 and continue through Sunday September 28, 2014.

We will still be having seminars at the NGE, which will take place Thursday, Friday, and Saturday. Featured speakers include: Dr. Fred Homeyer,

Deborah Niemann-Boehle. A few others will also speak on topics relative to the goat industry. We will also be having an AI clinic and a Buck collection at the NGE given and be-Carwell of B & D Livestock. There will also be 2 fitting clinics done by Crede Garriott; 1 on a boer wether and 1 on a boer doe.

# REPORT: European Regional Conference on Goats 2014 (continued from Page 1)

The participants of the conference were arriving from: Albania, Armenia, Belarus, Czech Republic, France, Georgia, Greece, Hungary, Italy, Latvia, Macedonia (The Former Yugoslav Republic of), Moldova, Montenegro, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Russian Federation, Serbia, Slovakia, Spain, Ukraine, as well as South Africa, USA, Mexico, New-Zealand, Malaysia, Israel, Turkey, Lebanon, Egypt, Morocco.

There were five sessions held within the conference

- 1) Breeding;
- 2) Nutrition;
- Environment and production systems;
- 4) Animal health;
- 5) Human Health, along with one round-table (on animal welfare of goats), and three separate workshops on different sections of goat reproduction.

As many as 92 papers were in-

troduced as oral presentations (ten of them were invited speakers) and new scientific results were also shown on 19 posters. 184 participants from 29 countries participated in the conference programmes.

During the technical tours four goat farms (three of them having milk processing plants) and one national park (with all indigenous domestic animal breeds of Hungary) were introduced to the participants. All information was given in two languages in English and in Russian, and also Hungarian translation was offered for the Hungarian participants.

There was one post-conference tour offered to the participants in Romania on 12 April 2014 showing one big goat farm with milk processing plant.

The final program and the abstract of oral and poster

presentations were printed. The booklet was given to all participants upon arrival.

## Conference background and justification

During the 11<sup>th</sup> International Conference on Goats, held in 2012 in Las Palmas de Gran Canaria (Spain), the Board of the International Goat Association (IGA) authorized the Hungarian Sheep and Goat Dairying Public Utility Association to organise a European Regional Conference on Goats in 2014 in cooperation with Caprirom Romania. Based on an agreement between the Hungarian and Romanian Country Representatives of the IGA, the conference was organised as a joint Hungarian-Romanian event, named as "European Regional Conference on Goats 2014." Most part of the conference took place in Hungary (Debrecen), while the last day's program was carried out in Romania (Oradea).
