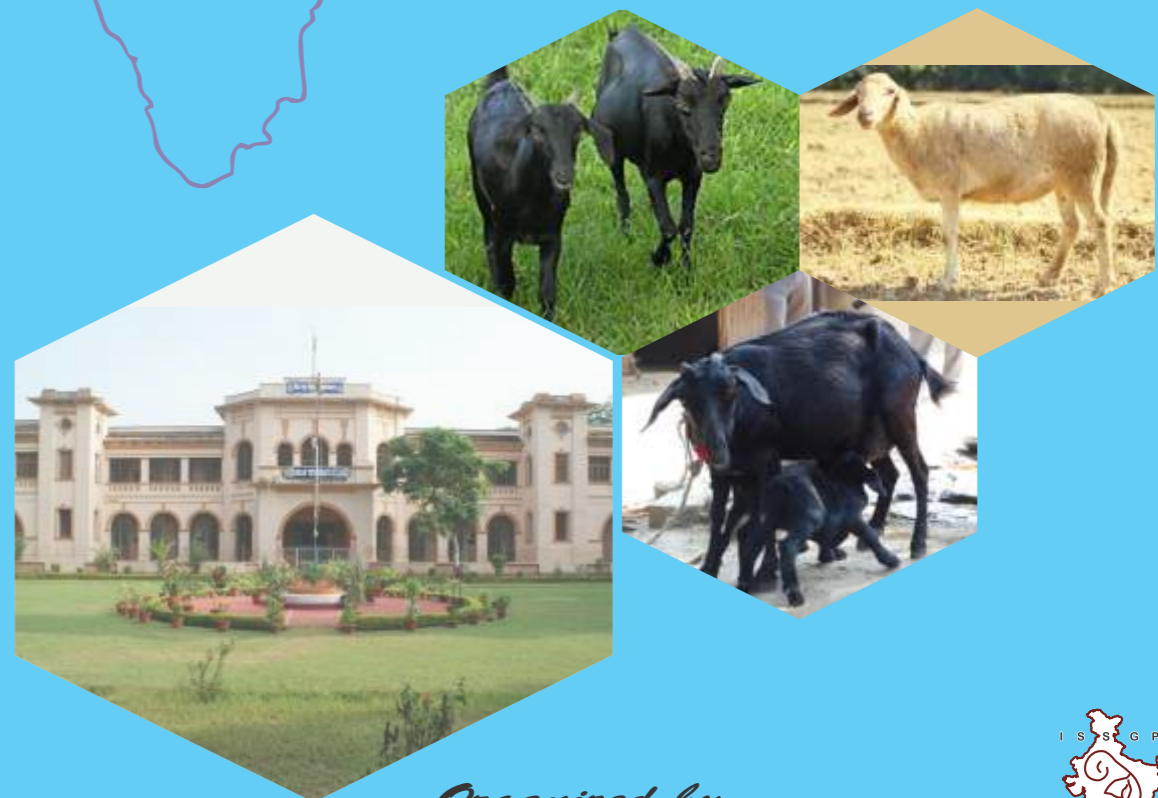

Invitation:

It is our great pleasure that the Indian Society for Sheep and Goat Production and Utilization (ISSGPU) invites you to its National Seminar on the theme "Current Scenario and Future Strategies for Augmenting Productivity of Small Ruminants" to be held at Bihar Animal Sciences University, Patna on February 14-16, 2019. Being the 5th largest goat population state, Bihar contributes about 7.63% of India's total goat population. The state is also a habitat of 42.6% people below the poverty line and hence there is a tremendous scope of goat farming to meet out the large gap between demand and supply of meat. Goat, in the true sense, is called as poor man's cow due to its tremendous economic importance in contributing milk, meat and ultimately the household nutrition security and livelihood to the downtrodden people. The state occupies a vast area under a rainfed system with regular occurrence of either flood or drought or both. The Bihar have genetic tract of Sahabadi Sheep and is also known for traditional preparation of delicious "Champan Meat" in earthen pot. This conference intends to bring Scientists, Faculties, Research Scholars, Entrepreneurs, Veterinary Doctors, Industry and Sheep and Goat farmers together at the same platform to discuss the issue related to sheep and goat in India for doubling the income of the farmers.



ISSGPU:

The Indian Society for Sheep and Goat Production and Utilization was established in the year 1982 with nearly 1054 life members. The society is a group of an active member of professional, researchers, Veterinarian and policymaker, which is engaged in the research and development of the sheep and goat production in the country. We encourage young and middle career scientist to apply for the award with their proof of age and ISSGPU Registration number. The applicant should have at least one and ten years of life membership of ISSGPU and the age of the Young & Middle Career Scientist should be below 35 and 48 years, respectively. Submission of the full paper/detail application proforma for Young & Middle Career Scientist is mandatory. The scrutinized candidates will be called for presentation for his/her research contributions toward the sheep and goat. All participating Scientists are requested to send the abstract by email latest by **January 11, 2019 to issgpu18@gmail.com**. The abstract should be written in single-space using Times New

Roman font of 12 Size and it should not be of more than 300 words as per standard format. The title of the abstract should be followed by name of the authors with a complete postal address and e-mail of the presenting author. Acceptance of the abstract for oral/poster presentation will be communicated by e-mail.
